INTERNSHIP SUMMARY:

The Sustainable Development Institute (SDI) at the College of Menominee Nation (CMN) – Keshena Campus seeks a paid Tribal Climate Relations Research Intern for the 2016 fall semester. The intern will work with a team to evaluate and identify the methods and ways to understand the best methods for sustainability and climate change scientists to work with Tribes. The intern will read literature about sustainability and climate change, connections between Tribal knowledge and science, learn about Indigenous forms of project evaluation and planning, and get a basic exposure to research methods in social science.

The intern will be an essential part of critical work on the front lines of climate change issues that affect the day-to-day life of American Indians in the United States. A limited amount of travel may be required.

INTERNSHIP DESCRIPTION:

- Work with team members and individually on assignments related to the grant.
- Explore sustainability issues in the face of climate change.
- Read literature related to the project.
- Attend appropriate and approved meetings outside of SDI office.
- Develop and present overview of internship experience to CMN and broader communities.
- Explore climate change literature and materials to become familiar with current facts and findings.
- Learn about research design and Indigenous research and evaluation protocol.
- Perform other job-related duties as assigned.
- Limited travel may be required. (Travel is paid for.)

Program Requirements/Qualifications:

- Current college student, CMN students will be given priority.
- Must have an accumulative GPA of 2.75 or better on a 4.0 scale.
- Must have completed at least one semester of her/his studies.
- Must be 18 years of age or older.
- Must be at least a 3 quarter time student (9 credits).
- Ability to communicate effectively in person, on the phone, and in writing for a variety of audiences.
- Must be able to travel.
- Highly motivated, engaged, and quickly responsive to work-related requests.



- Detail-oriented with ability to keep accurate, complete and timely work records.
- Commitment to working with diverse audiences.
- Interest in climate change research is essential.
